ENGLISH LANGUAGE ENTRANCE (05.003)

POLICY

Northland Polytechnic requires that students from non-English speaking backgrounds have appropriate levels of English language skills to enable them to successfully undertake their programme of study and this is demonstrated and documented before enrolment.

PURPOSE

This policy describes the English language standard required to enable students from non-English speaking backgrounds to successfully complete mainstream programmes at Northland Polytechnic.

APPLICATION AND SCOPE

This policy applies to all Northland Polytechnic programmes, except English language programmes.

International English Language Testing System.
- *TOEFL*
Test of English as a Foreign Language. TOEFL is an independent objective and worldwide English language testing system which originated in United States of America.
- *ESOL*
English as a second language

PROCEDURES AND GUIDELINES

- 1.0 Each programme will follow the English language entrance requirement as set for certificates, diplomas and degrees as specified in Schedule A attached.
- 2.0 The Academic Board may vary these entry requirements in individual cases.

- 3.0 In addition to IELTS and TOEFL scores, other documented English language proficiency will be considered as a means to assess the students' readiness to undertake a programme/course at Northland Polytechnic.
- 4.0 For Students from non-English speaking backgrounds the method of assessment of English competence and the outcome of this assessment shall be recorded and retained in their student file

<p>SCHEDULE A</p> <p>IELTS LEVELS FOR NON-ENGLISH SPEAKING STUDENTS</p>

This schedule applies both to International Students and non-English speaking New Zealand residents. It sets out the minimum IELTS score for student entry requirements that may be included in programme approval documents. Individual programmes may specify higher scores in student entry requirements.

Foundation Programmes which include communication skills	5.0
Certificate Programmes	5.5
Diploma Programmes	6.0
Bachelor Degrees	6.0
