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Business degree structure

A business degree typically consists of three types of papers:

Core papers are compulsory for all majors and provide the foundational knowledge for the degree.

Major compulsory papers provide the specialist knowledge. In the business degree the Industry Project is included. For a Maori Enterprise major, our akonga would be required to undertake a project based on a Maori organisation or an organisation with appropriate kaupapa.

Elective papers enable akonga to explore areas of interest relevant to their aspirations.

Possible papers

Possible papers at year two (level six) are Matauranga Maori and Kaitiakitanga and at year three Governance and Maori Enterprise. There are two ways to approach the design task:

1. Settle on the broad topics of the four papers and then develop learning outcomes.
2. Develop learning outcomes and cluster them into papers.

All this should be done with the graduate outcomes for the business degree in mind.

Te Reo

We feel that a compulsory Te Reo paper may create too significant a barrier for degree completion as a level six Te Reo paper requires a high degree of language proficiency. A level six Te Reo paper could be an elective paper. This gives the opportunity for fluent speakers to get recognition of prior learning for that paper.

Our process

This hui and others will enable us to determine papers and draft learning outcomes. The drafts will then be circulated to you by email for your comment. The final draft will then be circulated again or presented at a hui.
